Acclaimed American artist Amie Siegel will speak on her work, focusing on her three-part installation Provenance, recently exhibited at The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York. Provenance is a touchstone in Siegel's work, with its accumulative, cinematic representation of economic and political cycles. For the past decade and a half, Siegel has worked between film, installation, photography, and performance, questioning the tropes of cinematic forms. Provenance enacts a slow reveal over multiple parts, stripping back the layers of patrimony that influence the cultural value of objects to ask a broad set of contemporary questions about the speculative markets of art and design.
